CALL TO ORDER & WELCOME:

Mayor Bell called the special meeting to order at 7:01 p.m. and welcomed those watching online and on television. City Clerk called the roll. In attendance via teleconference were: Mayor Daniel L. Bell, Commissioner Caroline Braden, Commissioner Rose Merritt, Commissioner Dan Murray, City Administrative Officer Brian Haney, and City Attorney Frank Wichmann.

Commissioner Braden led the invocation and Mayor Bell led the pledge of allegiance.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

August 12, 2020 - Special Commission Meeting

Mayor Bell called for a motion to approve the minutes of the August 12, 2020, Special Commission Meeting. Commissioner Murray so moved, with a second from Commissioner Merritt. Commission approved by unanimous vote.

LEGISLATION: Legislation was sent to and received by the commission prior to the meeting.

FIRST READING – ORDINANCE 362

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF TAYLOR MILL, IN KENTON COUNTY, KENTUCKY, PROVIDING FOR THE ANNUAL ASSESSMENT OF ALL REAL ESTATE AND PERSONAL PROPERTY, WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF TAYLOR MILL, AND THE AD VALOREM TAXATION THEREOF, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING ON JULY 1, 2020 AND ENDING ON JUNE 30, 2021 AND PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT AND COLLECTION OF SUCH TAXES, AND THE

DEPARTMENT REPORTS:

The Commission reviewed reports from the following staff members: City Administrator, Treasurer, Engineering, Fire/EMS, Legal Counsel, Parks and Recreation, Public Works, and Police.

City Engineer Shawn Riggs addressed the committee regarding High Ridge Drive between Wayman Branch and Ivy Ridge Drive. Kenton County provided an estimate of \$67,519 to make the reconstructive road repairs on High Ridge Drive in two problem areas. Mayor Bell called for a motion to pay Kenton County to do additional pavement repairs on the major section of High Ridge Drive and do the smaller upper section at a later date. Commissioner Murray made a motion with a second from Mayor Bell. The City Clerk called the roll.

Commissioner Merritt qualified her vote by expressing concern as to not knowing if the project would get done this Fall or not. If the project cannot be completed, then she is a proponent of waiting until January 2021 to put it out to bid for a better price.

Public Works Director, Marc Roden requested that his department be granted permission to purchase a truck for the snow removal. One the department vehicles has been determined to be unsafe and no longer drivable. Commissioner Merritt asked for information and pricing so that it can be discussed at the upcoming special commission meeting.

There being no further business to discuss, Mayor Bell called for a motion to adjourn. Commissioner Murray so moved, with a second from Commissioner Braden to adjourn the meeting. The motion passed with the majority approval of the Commission, the time being 8:09 p.m.
