The new term for our city commission officially began on January 1, 2021. The commissioners have formed a solid working group that is focused on remaining fiscally responsible. 2021 Street Program

The streets scheduled for milling and paving this year are: Winston Hill Drive, Cardinal Drive, Meadow Lane, and portions of Reidlin Road. In addition, city crews will continue concrete repair and spot patching around the city.

Sidewalk Project Phase 3- Design Phase Begins in 2021

The city received an \$846,000.00 OKI Transportation Improvement Program grant to complete the sidewalk on Taylor Mill Road. This third and final phase of the project will extend the sidewalk from Saddlebrook to Walnut Dr. and complete a walkable loop in the city. The grant money for the Design Phase of this project will be released this year, providing \$173,456.00. Right-of-way acquisition will begin in 2022, followed by construction in late 2022/early 2023. Please remember the city is responsible for a 20% match for this grant.
