See-Click-Fix App: In an effort to enhance communication and provide residents with a more efficient way to report non -emergency issues and provide feedback, we are excited to announce the launch of See-Click-Fix App.

Download the See-Click-Fix App FREE: Available in the iTunes and Google Play App stores. (Be sure to allow the app to access your location and photos for easier reporting.)

Use the App to Report Issues: Potholes, Curbside Recycling & Trash Collection, Sidewalk Repair, Park Maintenance, Snow Plowing, Storm Water Drainage/Flooding, Street Lights, Traffic Signal, Traffic or Street Sign, Hazardous Trees, Water or Sanitary Sewer Inquiry, Illegal Dumping, Graffiti, and more.

How to Report an Issue with See-Click-Fix:

Click the 'Report an Issue' button.

Choose to take a photo, upload a photo or just write a description.

Type in the location of the issue.

Select the issue you want to report from the menu or type it in.

Click submit.

Messages are forwarded directly to CAO Brian Haney or City Clerk Kristy Webb. The appropriate department is then notified to work to resolve the issue. You will receive notifications when your request has been updated. You can also follow neighbor's service requests that you care about and specific locations where you want to help be part of the fix like cleaning up a park or shoveling snow for a neighbor.

Street Repair Prioritized: Our city engineer is conducting the annual assessment of our city streets. This annual report provides a ranking of the 125 streets in the city and is used to determine which streets are repaired based on the city budget for that year. As a small city with a limited budget, targeting streets on a yearly basis enables us to keep taxes in check and provide quality police, fire and maintenance services to resi-
