

ORDINANCE NO. 316 (12-14-16)

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY TAYLOR MILL, IN KENTON COUNTY, KENTUCKY, AMENDING ORDINANCE 161 IN REGARD TO A PARKS, PLAYGROUND AND RECREATION SYSTEM TO CONFORM TO THE REQUIREMENTS OF K.R.S. 65.870.**

**WHEREAS**, a parks, playground and recreation system was established for the City of Taylor Mill in 2000 through the enactment of Ordinance 161; and

**WHEREAS**, Ordinance 161 includes a provision prohibiting the possession of a firearm in Pride Park by anybody other than peace officers; and

**WHEREAS**, that provision is contrary to K.R.S. 65.870;

**NOW, THEREFOR BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF TAYLOR MILL, IN KENTON COUNTY, KENTUCKY, AS FOLLOWS:**

**Section 1.0 Ordinance Amendment**

Subsection 2 of Section II of Taylor Mill Ordinance 161 is hereby amended as follows, with the text thereof being added indicated by a single solid line beneath it and the text being deleted indicated by brackets around it and a single solid line drawn through it, all as required by K.R.S. 83A.060:

**SECTION II**

Nobody other than officers and employees of the City shall cause, promote, permit, allow, aid, encourage or engage in any of the following activities or occurrences within Pride Park, which is located at 5614 Taylor Mill Road, Taylor Mill, KY.

2. The [~~possession~~] discharge of a firearm by anybody other than in the defense of person or property or by members of the Taylor Mill Police Department or any other peace officer.

**Section 2.0 Provisions Severable**

The provisions of this ordinance are severable; and the invalidity of any provision of this ordinance shall not affect the validity of any other provision thereof; and such other provisions shall remain in full force and effect as long as they remain valid in the absence of those provisions determined to be invalid.

**Section 3.0 Repeal of Conflicting Provisions**


All ordinances or parts of ordinances of the City in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

**Section 4.0 Effective Date**

This ordinance shall be effective as soon as possible according to law.

**Section 5.0 Publication**

This ordinance shall be published in summary pursuant to K.R.S. 83A.060.
