

ORDINANCE NO. 317 (01-11-2017)

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF TAYLOR MILL IN KENTON COUNTY KENTUCKY, PROHIBITING THE OPERATION OF COMMERCIAL TRUCKS ON PORTIONS OF BLACKSTONE CT AND MCCOWAN DR. IN THE CITY OF TAYLOR MILL, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF TAYLOR MILL, IN KENTON COUNTY, KENTUCKY, AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1.0 - Definitions:**

As used herein, the following words and phrases have the meanings indicated for them:

1.1 The word “anybody” means any human being, or any organization or combination thereof, in the form of a corporation, partnership, joint venture, unincorporated association or otherwise.

1.2 The words “commercial truck” mean any motor vehicle with a gross vehicle weight rating (GVWR) of more than 10,000 pounds.

1.3 The words “motor vehicle” mean any wheeled vehicle propelled by any means other than gravity or muscular power.

1.4 The word “nobody” means no human being, or any organization or combination thereof, in the form of a corporation, partnership, joint venture, unincorporated association or otherwise.

1.5 The word “sign” means a sign designed, made, installed, and maintained according to the specifications of the Bureau of Highways of the Transportation Cabinet of the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

**Section 2.0 - Sign Location**

The Public Works Department of the City of Taylor Mill shall cause signs prohibiting commercial trucks to be installed, located and maintained at the following locations:

2.1 Within the northerly side of the right of way of the street identified and known as Blackstone Ct. at the intersection thereof with the right of way of Pride Parkway so that the sign is facing motor vehicle traffic proceeding in an easterly direction on Blackstone Ct.

2.2 Within the easterly side of the right of way of the street identified and known as Maple Ridge Dr. at the intersection thereof with the right of way of street identified and known as McCowan Dr. so that the sign is facing motor vehicle traffic proceeding in an easterly direction on McCowan Dr.

**Section 3.0 - Prohibition:**

Nobody shall cause, promote, aid, assist, encourage, allow or engage in the operation of any commercial truck on either:

- 3.1 Any portion of the street identified and known as Blackstone Ct.; or
- 3.2 Any portion of the street identified and known as McCowan Dr. between the streets identified and known as Maple Ridge Dr. and Blackstone Ct.

**Section 4.0 - Penalties:**

Each violation and every other failure to comply with the provisions of this ordinance shall be a violation; and each day of the continuation thereof shall be a separate and distinct offense for which everybody convicted thereof in a court of competent jurisdiction shall be sentenced to pay a criminal fine not to exceed the maximum amount of \$250.00 as set forth in K.R.S. 534.050 (2) (c).

**Section 5.0 - Provisions Severable:**

The provisions of this ordinance are severable; and the invalidity of any provision of this ordinance shall not affect the validity of any other provision thereof; and such other provisions shall remain in full force and effect as long as they remain valid in the absence of those provisions determined to be invalid.

**Section 6.0 - Conflicting Ordinances Repealed:**

All other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

**Section 7.0 - Effective Date:**

This ordinance shall be effective as soon as possible according to law.

**Section 8.0 - Publication:**

This ordinance shall be published in summary pursuant to K.R.S. 83A.060 (9).
