

ORDINANCE NO. 319 (5-10-2017)

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF TAYLOR MILL, IN KENTON COUNTY, KENTUCKY, ESTABLISHING REGULATIONS FOR MOTOR VEHICLE TRAFFIC ON HIGH RIDGE DRIVE AND WAYMAN BRANCH ROAD IN THE CITY OF TAYLOR MILL, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF TAYLOR MILL, IN KENTON COUNTY, KENTUCKY, AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1.0 - Definitions:**

As used herein, the following words and phrases have the meanings indicated therefor:

1.1 The word “anybody” means any human being, or any organization or combination thereof, in the form of a corporation, partnership, joint venture, unincorporated association or otherwise.

1.2 The word “nobody” means no human being, or any organization or combination thereof, in the form of a corporation, partnership, joint venture, unincorporated association or otherwise.

1.3 The words “motor vehicle” mean any wheeled vehicle propelled by any means other than muscular power.

1.4 The words “stop sign” mean a stop sign designed, made, installed, and maintained according to the specifications of the Bureau of Highways of the Transportation Cabinet of the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

**Section 2.0 - Stop Sign Location**

The Public Works Department of the City of Taylor Mill shall cause a stop sign to be installed, located and maintained At the following locations:

2.1 Within the southeasterly right of way of Ivy Ridge Dr. at the intersection thereof with the southerly right of way of High Ridge Drive, so that the stop sign is facing motor vehicle traffic operated in a northeasterly direction on Ivy Ridge Drive.

2.2 At the northeastern corner of the intersection of Wayman Branch Road with High Ridge Drive, so that the stop sign is facing motor vehicle traffic operated in a southeasterly direction on that portion

of Wayman Branch Road that extends from the intersection in a northeasterly direction and is a dead-end street.

**Section 3.0 - Prohibition:**

Nobody shall cause, promote, aid, assist, encourage, allow or engage in the operation of any motor vehicle on either Ivy Ridge Drive or Wayman Branch Road in the City of Taylor Mill in such a manner that the motor vehicle passes any stop sign facing the motor vehicle, without the movement of the motor vehicle being fully and completely stopped at and immediately before passing the stop sign installed and located pursuant to the provisions of this ordinance.

**Section 4.0 - Penalties:**

Each violation and every other failure to comply with the provisions of this ordinance shall be a violation; and each day of the continuation thereof shall be a separate and distinct offense for which everybody convicted thereof in a court of competent jurisdiction shall be sentenced to pay a criminal fine not to exceed the maximum amount of \$250.00 as set forth in K.R.S. 534.050 (2) (c).

**Section 5.0 - Provisions Severable:**

The provisions of this ordinance are severable; and the invalidity of any provision of this ordinance shall not affect the validity of any other provision thereof; and such other provisions shall remain in full force and effect as long as they remain valid in the absence of those provisions determined to be invalid.

**Section 6.0 - Conflicting Ordinances Repealed:**

All other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

**Section 7.0 - Effective Date:**

This ordinance shall be effective as soon as possible according to law.

**Section 8.0 - Publication:**

This ordinance shall be published in summary pursuant to K.R.S. 83A.060 (9).

No section of Taylor Mill Ordinance No. 319 imposes any tax or fee.


